## ICC Commission on Arbitration and ADR The Evolution

#### Overall manageable size

### **Specified Number of Delegates** per NC to:

- ensure a fair distribution of Commission Members among NCs;
- ensure regional representation that is proportionate to the composition of the ICC global network;
- reflect the importance of emerging jurisdictions; and
- reflect the strategic importance of arbitration and ADR hubs

## ICC Commission on Arbitration and ADR The Evolution

### Fostering professional and regional diversity

#### **Additional Delegates**

NCs may appoint up to five additional NC members as delegates over and above their specified number of delegates within their category, who:

- are in-house counsel or otherwise corporate representatives with experience in arbitration and/or ADR; (professional diversity)
- are nationals of or are professionally based in the same region, in a country where there is no NC. (regional diversity)

## ICC Commission on Arbitration and ADR The Evolution

#### Fostering professional and regional diversity

- Balanced Overall Representation and Diversity NC Delegation reflects diversity, broadly defined (including but not limited to diversity of origin, culture, generations and gender). NCs should endeavour to reach gender parity within their NC Delegation.
- **Experience and Talent**
- Balance among Law Firms, Chambers, and Companies
- **Corporate Engagement**
