## Mapping Exercise: Trade and trade policy aspects along the lifecycle of products

 At the TESSD High-Level Stocktaking event on 2 December 2022, Members agreed to pursue a mapping exercise to build a broader understanding of the trade aspects of the circular economy which are relevant to each part of the life cycle

- Mapping exercise covers:
  - Initiatives and experiences shared by Members
  - Measures relating to the circular economy in notifications and trade policy reviews (TPRs) from the WTO Environmental Database
  - Trade aspects of the circular economy based on presentations, analytical work and discussions in the Working Group



#### Measures by circular economy activity / objective

- The majority of measures relate to downstream stages of the lifecycle, and take the form of either support measures or technical regulations and conformity assessment procedures.
- A good number of measures have circular economy aspects or elements; only few measures have a specific focus on the circular economy.


